Dear Mr. Lambert:

Your letter addressed to Commissioner Raymund Paredes, has been forwarded to me for a response. Ms. Moore's inquiry was the first we had received concerning home schooled students eligibility for the Texas B-On-Time loan. House Bill 1250, from the 80th Regular Session of the Texas Legislature, permits home schooled students to be eligible to receive a loan through the Texas B-On-Time loan program so long as the student meets the program requirements. Students graduating from a public or private high school (including home school programs) are to be treated the same.

We will begin the process of changing our program rules immediately. I am unable to provide a specific date of when the rules changes will become effective. Regardless of the rule changes, please be assured that home schooled students are eligible to receive a loan through the Texas B-On-Time loan program so long as the student meets the program requirements.
